
James “Buzz” Elmore Cason, 84, of Franklin, TN, passed away peacefully at his home on June 16, 2024. Buzz was born on November 27, 1939, in Nashville, TN, to James Roy Cason and Rosa Jordan Cason. At the age of nine, Buzz professed his faith in Jesus at Inglewood Baptist Church and was baptized. His life verse is John 6:47, “Very truly I tell you, the one who believes has eternal life”. Buzz was a member of Brentwood Baptist Church for years and later joined Forest Hills Baptist Church and taught Sunday School at both places. He was truly grateful for all his brothers in Christ and Dr. Jerry Winfield at the Wednesday morning Bible studies. Buzz and longtime friend Dickey Lee co-founded Giving in Faith Together (GIFT) around 1996, a nonprofit foundation helping musicians, musical families, and others in need. An early talent for writing began in first grade when Buzz won a poetry contest with his poem about a bunny. Due to his tremendous interest reading the magazines his father brought home from the office, at the age of 12 Buzz started paying for newspaper delivery due to his family’s strict budget and disciplined himself as an avid reader over the years for knowledge and ideas that influenced his writings. Buzz’s entrepreneurial spirit took off with his first job at age ten when he operated a popsicle pushcart with his assistant and childhood friend, Aaron Brown. Buzz bought the popsicles for five cents each and sold them for six cents each in his Inglewood neighborhood in East Nashville. This experience was the inspiration for the “Popsicle” song co-written by his business partner Bobby Russell in 1962. As a successful American rock singer, songwriter, recording studio pioneer, and author, Buzz’s music career spanned over seven decades, including time in England, France, Germany and Australia, and he had friends worldwide. In 1956 while Buzz was an art student at Isaac Litton High School in East Nashville, a friend invited

him to the TV station, WSIX, where the local DJ, Noel Ball, hosted a show "Saturday Showcase". Buzz hung out at the station painting sets and pantomiming the R & B songs with buddies as The Manhattans. Noel let Buzz sing "Blue Suede Shoes" with the Richard Williams Trio. This led Buzz at age 16 to become a founding member of The Casuals, Nashville's first rock & roll band in 1956 which became a successful touring act and Brenda Lee's backing band. In 1957 he wrote his very first song "My Love Song for You" recorded by The Casuals, and a year later he co-wrote "Tennessee" with Bobby Russell recorded by Jan and Dean. Later, Buzz and keyboardist Richard Williams teamed up with Hugh Jarrett of The Jordanaires to record as The Statues. In 1960 Buzz started a solo career with the hit "Look for A Star" under the name Garry Miles. While working as Snuff Garrett's assistant in Los Angeles in 1962, Buzz and Leon Russell produced The Crickets in a version of the song "La Bamba". When The Crickets lead singer Jerry Naylor became ill, Buzz filled in as lead singer and played rhythm with the group on a summer concert tour of the UK in 1964. In 1970 Buzz became the founder and owner of the legendary Creative Workshop recording studio in Berry Hill. After recording engineer Travis Turk introduced him to Jimmy Buffett, Buzz became Jimmy's first publisher and co-wrote some songs with him. Other engineers at the studio through the years include Brent Maher, Joe Funderburk and Parker Cason. Additional artists who recorded at Creative Workshop include Brenda Lee, Leon Russell, Roy Orbison, Dolly Parton, Jerry Reed, Merle Haggard, The Gatlin Brothers, The Judds, The Doobie Brothers, Emmylou Harris, Olivia Newton-John, The Derailers, Sugarcane Jane, Brooks Forsyth and the list goes on. Buzz sang backup vocals for Elvis Presley, Kenny Rogers, John Denver and other notable artists. Buzz released albums and performed with his own bands, The Love Notes and B C & The Dartz. In 2015 he released the album "Record Machine" featuring his son Parker who co-wrote the song "Record Machine" and played on several tracks. Buzz and fellow songwriter Billy Swan produced the album "Billy & Buzz Sing Buddy" in 2018, a tribute to Buddy Holly. Buzz collaborated with sons Taylor and Parker on the album "Buzz Cason & Sons 2020" featuring Taylor on vocals for a new version of "Soldier of Love". Buzz recorded the album "Sing!" featuring his children and existing grandchildren at the time. In 2020 Buzz produced and Mark Harper directed the documentary "BERRY HILL! From Creative Workshop and Beyond" about Creative Workshop and the recording scene in the Berry Hill neighborhood of Nashville, TN that evolved from it. Alamo Jones of Sirius XM's Outlaw Country station and others have called Buzz Cason the "Father of Nashville Rock". He was the voice of "Alvin" on three Chipmunks records. In 2004 he released his auto-biography "Living the Rock & Roll Dream: The Adventures of Buzz Cason". Regarding the book, Kris Kristofferson wrote, "He is living proof that nice guys do just fine, and they have the most fun." In 2014 Buzz was honored by the Country Music Hall of fame by Michael Gray as part of their Poets & Prophets series and in 2019 Campbellsville University awarded Buzz an honorary Doctorate of Musical Arts degree. He was also a member of the Rockabilly Hall of Fame. In 1956 Randy was selected as a National Merit Scholar at Isaac Litton High School in Nashville TN. In 1957 17-year-old Randy was one of two Tennesseans to receive an award in the Sixteenth Annual Science Talent Search for Science Scholarships sponsored by the Westinghouse Foundation. He won the Tennessee state-wide science fair that year. Randy was preceded in death by his parents Mary Haze (Williamson) Pack and Ralph Lemman Pack and his older brother Charles R. Pack. Tom Reeves retired professor at Boston's Roxbury Community College who died in Baltimore on Sunday February 19 2012 of heart failure at age 72 was a social activist in many arenas.

There is a family tale of descent from the great Virginia patriot Patrick Henry. Though Tom would agree with "Give me liberty or give me death " the fiery Thomas Paine was his real spiritual ancestor. Like Paine Tom was a great organizer and cantankerous visionary. He was a civil-rights activist in the South in the 1950s and '60s an anti-Vietnam War campaigner who helped bring an end to the draft a gay-rights organizer a voice in the wilderness calling for reform of sex laws an advocate for those with HIV/AIDS and an agitator against U.S. support of repression in the Caribbean especially Haiti. From 1976 to 2001 Reeves taught at Boston's historically black Roxbury Community College where he became a full professor of social sciences and director of the school's Caribbean Focus program. Tom had a particular interest in the plight of Haiti writing and speaking frequently about the country and joining a number of delegations and humanitarian missions for which he was honored by the Haitian government. At Tom's invitation the then recently-overthrown Haitian president Jean-Bertrand Aristide spoke at the college and received an honorary degree in April 1992. Born in Nashville Tennessee in 1939 Tom was ordained a Methodist minister and pastored a church in Blue Springs Alabama while attending Birmingham Southern College from which he graduated in 1960. He went on to get a Master's of Divinity from Harvard in 1963 and an MA from American University in 1964. Tom did further postgraduate study (1964-66) at the Otto Suhr Institute of Political Science and Humboldt University both in Berlin. From his earliest days as a minister Tom was attracted by the example of Martin Luther King Jr. with whom he sometimes worked and was involved in many protests marches and sit-ins. An article in the New York Times (April 12 1960) "Fear and Hatred Grip Birmingham " notes the arrest of "Thomas Reeves a 21-year- old white student at Birmingham-Southern College and part-time preacher " It was the earliest of many arrests and stints in jail that Tom faced for his political activism. In the late '60s Tom worked and taught in Washington D.C. teaching at among other schools American University. He was the director of the National Council to Repeal the Draft. From 1969 to '71 he was a speechwriter for US senators Michael Gravel Mike Hatfield and George McGovern the latter two of whom wrote introductions to *The End of the Draft* (Random House and Vintage Press 1970) a book Tom co-wrote with Barry Goldwater speechwriter Karl Hess. Tom's work against the draft brought him to national prominence. A front-page story in the Harvard Crimson (March 2 1970) reported on his speech the night before at Kirkland House. "[T]here is a realistic chance of repealing the draft' in view of the wide-ranging agreement across the political spectrum on this issue " the paper reported. "Reeves said that 'people are challenging the idea that the central state should have the power to tell others how to run their lives.'" After returning to Boston in the early '70s Tom joined the burgeoning gay liberation movement based around the Charles Street Coffeehouse. He frequently contributed to *Gay Community News*. As part of the radical Fag Rag collective and the Boston-Boise Committee he tried to create a liberated gay culture. Garrett Byrne Suffolk County district attorney was running for reelection in 1977. He turned two series of arrests for public lewdness in Boston Public Library restrooms and for statutory rape at a house in Revere into an anti-gay crusade. Tom Reeves and his fellow Fag Rag members ministers and congregants of the Metropolitan Community Church and other gay leaders fought back forming the Boston-Boise Committee. Gore Vidal spoke at a benefit for the group at Arlington Street Church an event a justice on the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court sparked controversy by attending. Through demonstrations public meetings and publicity Byrne's campaign failed. The remaining criminal cases fizzled and Garrett Byrne was not reelected. As a follow-up to the Boston-Boise Committee Tom organized a conference on December 2 1978 on the issue of ages of consent.

At that conference a group later known as the North American Man/Boy Love Association was formed by a caucus of several dozen in attendance. Tom strove over many years to convey the message that sex was something to celebrate not fear. However moral panics ensued in the 1980s and '90s fueled by hysterias over the McMartin preschool case 'Satanic abuse ' and recovered memories. All were shown to be without basis but were used to hammer NAMBLA. Less radical gays soon to be mainstream separated from Tom on this issue. Yet Tom was also a founding member and organizer of groups that would become more mainstream such as Gay and Lesbian Advocates and Defenders (GLAD) which grew out of the Boston-Boise Committee and later in the midst of the AIDS crisis ACT UP. "Tom was especially active as a member of ACT-UP / Boston's Housing Working Group " recalls Robert Folan. "The working group organized numerous ACT-UP demonstrations to bring pressure on the city of Boston to respond to a growing crisis of homelessness among people with HIV. The group's efforts resulted in the city committing to the development of new housing for PWAs. Over the next decade hundreds of housing units for people with HIV would be created to alleviate the homeless problem." Tom's writings appeared in such diverse publications as the Baltimore Sun Counterpunch Montreal Gazette NACLA Report (on Central American affairs) and Z Magazine. Tom's last years were spent in Montreal Baltimore and Spain. "As an ordained Methodist minister since his teens Reeves always lived his life according to the highest Christian ideals " said longtime friend and investigative journalist James Dubro. "He gave a lot of himself daily to those less fortunate and to marginalized minorities throughout his life." Tom suffered a lot for his beliefs in the last quarter century of his life. Not for his religious beliefs which were conventional enough (he particularly subscribed to the ecumenical Taizé movement) but for his belief in the importance of challenging the U.S.'s ever more punitive sex laws and particularly sex-offender registries which he considered analogous to the Puritan scarlet letter. "Tom was of the Tzadik Nistar " Dubro goes on referring to the mystical Judaic contention that God will spare a city if it contains even a few just men. "He counted among the 36 righteous who justify the existence of man to God." A memorial service is set for Saturday April 28 2012 at 3 p.m. at the Community Church of Boston (565 Boylston Street) in Copley Square. JOHN EDWARD SMITH



Before graduating high school in 1957 John Smith was breaking news stories and providing photographs for Nashville newspapers and television stations. His first love was the 4x5 Speed Graphic camera with a strobe flash made famous by his hero New York City press photographer Arthur "Weegee" Fellig known for his telling black-and-white images. Smith later moved to film and video spending much of his career as a CBS cameraman his wife Jan estimating that he shot in over 100 countries including covering multiple wars and era-defining events such as the Tiananmen Square protests. John Smith 80 died unexpectedly of a heart

attack on Jan. 29 at his home in Nashville where he and Jan had lived since his 2017 retirement from WSB-TV. He worked for the Atlanta station the last 22 years of his career. A private "Celebration of Life" was held Feb. 8 in Nashville. His many jobs at the Atlanta TV station included organizing reporting crews tracking their whereabouts the stories they were working and plotting how they would fit into the station's daily newscasts. "He did the work of several people" said Mark Winne a WSB-TV reporter for 34 years. "He was extremely calm under pressure almost serene. He never lost his cool. But then again this was a man who at one time had done his job with bullets flying around him." Which is putting it mildly. At CBS he covered conflicts in Nicaragua and Guatemala and during the 1980s the Salvadoran Civil War. But famously off and on from 1965 to 1975 he toiled in the marshes jungles and rice paddies of Vietnam. His son Cannon Smith points out that "huge amount of the footage" appearing in Ken Burn's 2017 television documentary "The Vietnam War" was shot by John. Jan Smith who usually accompanied her husband recalled "We always stayed at the Caravelle Hotel [in Saigon now Ho Chi Minh City] next to CBS's bureau." She remembers at one time waving from a balcony at soldiers called out to fight in the Tet Offensive. "That night many of them came back in body bags stacked in the back of trucks" she said. Remarkably John Smith had only one known close call he was wounded by shrapnel while filming a Viet Cong mortar attack outside Da Nang. He was air lifted to Hong Kong after his Vietnamese hospital was bombed. But after Vietnam he survived two airplane crashes in Central America and North America. He also walked away from two helicopter crashes and a Boeing 707 emergency landing in Brazil on a press plane covering President Reagan. Still the most ravaging toll on his body came from the day-to-day carting of a ponderous camera and equipment all over the world for nearly 30 years. Cannon Smith himself a news cameraman for 27 years said John had numerous surgeries on his back shoulder knees and elbows. He was born May 5 1939 in east Nashville and at Litton High School he joined the yearbook staff and camera club. Smith outgrew those adolescent associations and mimicking his idol Weegee began staying up half the night chasing ambulances fire trucks and police cars for local news outlets. Many times he took along childhood pal Billy Hoover who recalls getting phoned many times at 1 a.m. or later to photograph one disaster or another. Memorably he and Smith were first on the scene when Nashville's Hattie Cotton Elementary school was bombed in 1957 one day after admitting its first black student. The explosion crumbled walls and blew out every window causing \$71000 in damage. To this day no one has been charged. "He was driven to break a story no matter where or when" Hoover said. "At one time he had seven individual radios including two two-way police scanners. There are 93 counties in Tennessee not counting a couple and he knew the voices of every county police dispatcher so he knew where to go simply by hearing the tone of voice. He actually had a mobile phone in his car where the transmitter was in the trunk and the part you held was big as brick." Smith was hired out of high school by the local CBS affiliate eventually getting promoted to the national desk where he received the first of many Vietnam assignments. Both in Vietnam and for years after he worked alongside broadcasting legends like Walter Cronkite Dan Rather and longtime CBS correspondent Bert Quint. Quint covered so many wars and conflicts during his quarter century with the network that he was known as "The Fireman." He first met Smith in August 1967 and one of their first collaborations was in the Demilitarized Zone (between North and South Vietnam) lying in a bunker beneath a night sky fully lit with rockets and shells. He remembers that all they had to eat was raisins Smith had and occasionally "these large Vietnamese bugs" that carried off dropped raisins. "We always heard" Quint said "those bugs had a lot of protein. "The success I had as a

correspondent” Quint said recently “was due more to the camera team than to my own skills. The best camera people like John had an instinct not just for a story idea but a survival instinct. They knew how to get in and when to get out.” “There were frustrations and failures” he added. “I remember John and I getting on a two-seater plane and flying into North Vietnam we did I counted them 14 gut wrenching bomber dives. I know John got some incredible stuff but when we got back to the bureau we couldn’t use any of the footage. [The film] had somehow been damaged or scratched.” Smith’s globe hopping continued for nearly two decades post Vietnam his itinerary a virtual scrapbook of late 20th century world history.

He went to China with President Gerald Ford and covered Jimmy Carter’s 1976 presidential run. He was with Rather on his exclusive interview in Bagdad with Saddam Hussein and he was in Egypt when Anwar Sadat was assassinated. He was in China for the Tiananmen Square Protests; he covered dozens of space launches and the royal wedding of Charles and Diana. He occasionally shot for “60 Minutes” and Cannon Smith remembers as a child getting carried around on the shoulders of famed correspondent Ed Bradley. Smith was let go in the early 1990s as CBS shed veteran correspondents producers and camera teams. He started at WSB-TV in 1995 but his official position in the engineering news gathering department barely describes his contributions. Smith helped create WSB-TV’s current archival system. He also played a critical role a decade ago when the station transitioned from tape to digital which was only fitting for man who began his career using the oversized Speed Graphic press camera. “He was very proud of his career” friend and news editor Kisha Brown said “but he was very humble very quiet. You really had to pry stories out of him. For some in the newsroom he could be intimidating. But once you got to know him he was really loveable the kind of guy who loves talking about his cats and dog.” Childhood friend Hoover agrees with this depiction though he wishes Smith had shown a tad less humility. “Just a few weeks ago I was texting him to compile a book” Hoover said. “I’ve actually been on him to do it for several years. I personally have a lot of his darkroom equipment and negatives going back to the fifties. “But he wasn’t ever going to do it” Hoover concluded. “He was driven a go-getter like none other. But I don’t think he ever thought he was helping preserve history. The way he thought writing a book would be bragging or worse even a kind of arrogant.” Smith is survived by his wife Jan Smith and their son Cannon Smith along with daughters Stacye Smith Margery Smith Stephanie Smith and son Eric Smith.




